### "What are you doing for others?"

Lake Orion Community Schools is sponsoring its first ever Short Essay, Poetry, and Multimedia Contest for our first ever Dr. King Community Celebration. The theme for the 2019 Martin Luther King Jr. Celebration is taken from a famous quote of Dr. King's: "What are you doing for others?" All LOCS students are invited to create either a short essay, poem, or multimedia presentation (two minutes or less) that relates the theme. The winners of the contest (from each division) will win a prize from the LOHS Diversity Committee, recognition by their principal and the district, and they are invited to read or share their short essay, poem, or multimedia presentations at our Dr. King Community Celebration that will be held on Monday, January 21st at Lake Orion High School from 6:30-8:00 PM

Requirements: Essays/Poems/Multimedia Presentations should reflect the theme of "What are you doing for others?" All written work must include a title. Work should be original and submitted in either type written (doublespaced) or handwritten form.

There are three divisions of entry:

- Elementary (grades K-5) Limit 200 words
- Middle School (grades 6-8) Limit 300 words
- High School (grades 9-12) Limit 300 words

Multimedia Presentations should also reflect the theme and be no longer than two minutes. Video files can be submitted on a flash drive, email copy, or Google file, etc.

The contest is open to all LOCS students. Deadline for entries is Wednesday, January 9th. The winning entrants will be asked to read or present their poems, essays, or multimedia presentations at the LOCS Dr. King Community Celebration on Monday, January 21st at Lake Orion High School Auditorium from 6:30 – 8:00 PM.
